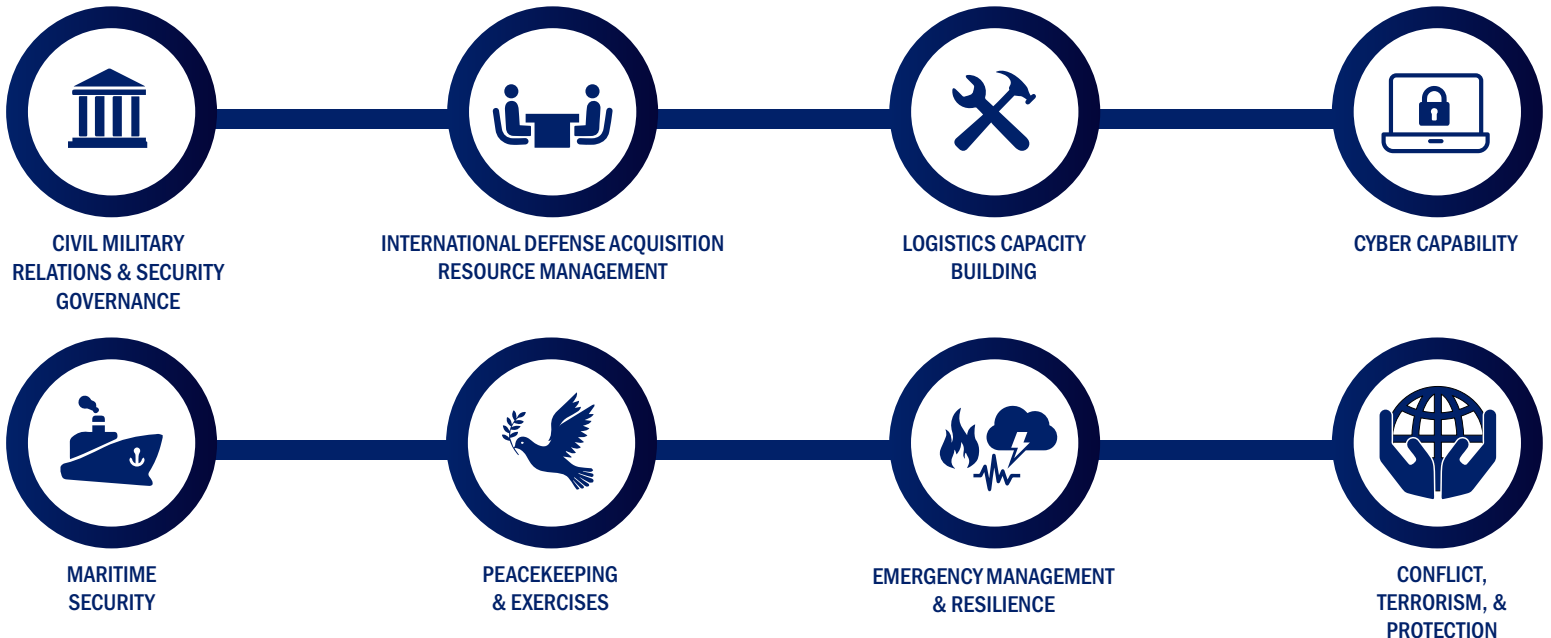
RESIDENT & MOBILE EDUCATION

ISG's Resident and Mobile Education provides military and civilian officials with unique education and professional development programs that support Security Cooperation and Institutional Capacity Building (ICB). Courses are designed to cultivate individual understanding of complex issues; foster peer-to-peer learning; and build international communities of interest. Education programs are implemented through Title 22 authorized programs (International Military Education and Training, Foreign Military Financing, Foreign Military Sales, and Peacekeeping Operations) and various Title 10 authorized programs such as Maritime Security Initiative and Regional Defense Combating Terrorism and Irregular Warfare Fellowship Program.

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FUNCTIONAL AREAS

ISG provides adaptable, scalable, and tailored educational programs across a wide array of functional areas to address U.S. and Partner Nation security objectives. The diagram below depicts the current functional capabilities of the Institute. These functional areas and their educational programs are developed based upon strategic guidance from the Departments of State and Defense; Geographic Combatant Command interests and focal areas; and Partner Nation requests.



FACULTY

ISG has a diverse faculty team grounded in professional experience from academic, military, government, and civil sectors. The core faculty are augmented by experts drawn from other parts of government, and American and international subject matter experts drawn from universities, industry, think tanks, international organizations, and non-governmental organizations.



MODES OF IMPLEMENTATION

Resident Education

Resident courses are primarily conducted at ISG headquarters in Monterey, California in an adult-learning style with breakout groups, interactive exercises, student-led presentations, and related approaches.

Mobile Education

Mobile courses are conducted in bilateral or multilateral formats in Partner Nations. Mobile events are tailored to the bilateral and/or regional context and designed in working group, workshop, and seminar format with learning elements designed to be both interactive and informative to the students.

Virtual/Hybrid Education

Virtual courses are conducted in a synchronous or combination synchronous/asynchronous format. Virtual courses are conducted in bilateral or multilateral formats and tailored to the country or regional context. Hybrid courses customarily include at least one in-person instructional team member to facilitate discussions.
