ISG AWARDED FOR EXCELLENCE



Over the past five years, ISG's collaborative work with Jordan, Colombia, and Ukraine has been acknowledged on four occasions with the prestigious U.S. Secretary of Defense Award in Maintenance Training, Advice, and Assistance of Foreign Security Forces - Ministerial Category.

Additionally, in 2022, the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff awarded the Joint Meritorious Unit Award for exceptionally meritorious service to Headquarters, United States Central Command, and select subordinate units. Eight ISG Resident Advisors (MoDAs), who were deployed in region at the time and contributed to the mission, were among those cited for this prestigious award.



In five years under the auspices of DSCA and our nearly 30 years of history as a DoD Security Cooperation implementing component, ISG has grown remarkably into a pivotal force within the Department of Defense, expanding our reach with our foreign partners and continuing to innovate and implement in all aspects of Security Cooperation.
