P179840 - Women, Leadership and National Defense

This course supports partner nations as they develop and implement gender policies aimed at augmenting the representation and prospects for women in security and defense institutions. It provides practical, strategic, and political insights into women's inclusion and promotion within decision and policymaking processes.

P179847 - Comprehensive Approaches to Counter Hybrid Threats

This course examines national, regional, and collective security capacity and capabilities requirements to support a comprehensive approach to countering hybrid threats. Participants will identify key public and private organizations; consider the impact of political processes and explore policies and cooperation frameworks; and analyze methodology that supports operational and strategic understanding, willingness, collaboration, and execution of a viable approach to counter hybrid threats.

P179623 - Principles of Defense Acquisition & Contract Management (English/Spanish)

This course provides participants with an understanding of the important concepts and challenges associated with defense acquisition decision making and contract management. It is regionally focused for the Latin American and Caribbean context and conducted with Spanish language simultaneous interpretation.

P173019 - Security and Irregular Migration

This course is designed to assist those responsible for the complex state security and humanitarian challenges that are posed by irregular migration. To overcome these challenges, this course explores comprehensive approaches, accompanying capabilities, and effective policies for the management and treatment of irregular migrants. It also investigates how whole-of-government approaches to irregular migration deter bad actors, strengthen society, secure the homeland, and meet foreign policy goals.

P179548 - Fundamentals of Maritime Security

This course covers transnational maritime threats (terrorism, armed robbery at sea, smuggling and trafficking of arms, drugs and people, IUU fishing, cyber, and pollution), and provides tools, strategies, and best practices to address those threats. It emphasizes how to enhance maritime domain awareness, maritime governance, port security, institutional capacity, and human capital development.

P170001 - Executive Program in Defense Decision Making

The goal of this course is to empower participants with the knowledge and skill sets needed to be effective decision-makers, and act as agents of change to transform their security institutions to address ever-evolving national security challenges.

P159200 - Principles of Defense Acquisition Management

This course provides participants with an understanding of the important concepts associated with defense acquisition and logistics decision making in a variety of national settings. Participants will examine the complete defense acquisition life cycle from planning through equipment disposal. International best practices are discussed along with the challenges associated with implementation.

P159202 - Principles of Defense Procurement and Contracting

This course provides a theoretical and practical examination of all phases of the contracting process. Fundamental concepts are discussed for both national and global defense contracting. International best practices are examined along with the challenges associated with institutionalizing efficient and effective procurement processes.

P179069 - International Defense Acquisition Negotiations

This course focuses on planning and preparing for negotiations with an emphasis on negotiation of complex issues in international armaments contracts. Particular emphasis is placed on the strategies, techniques and characteristics of good negotiators. Participants learn their negotiating style tendencies and how and when to adapt their negotiation style given the behavior and goals of the parties.

P170370 - Cybersecurity Policy & Practice

This course helps develop capabilities to defend cyberspace from attack. National security, economic prosperity, and citizen safety are threatened daily through exploitation, intrusion or disruption in cyberspace by criminal, transnational, or regional competitors. This offering explores cyber concepts and evolving technologies for decision makers to design and implement policies and practices for safeguarding the use of cyberspace.

P179928 - National Resilience for Defense & Security

This course will orient participants to successful 'whole-of-government' resilience models, in which all facets of society contribute to keeping their nation safe, sovereign, and functional. It will emphasize planning considerations and capabilities requirements for countering full spectrum threats and hazards that target the civil population and their access to security, timely and reliable information, and essential goods and services.

P170475 - Civil-Military Coordination in Disaster Relief

This course develops a comprehensive understanding of how national governments organize and use their armed forces to support domestic disaster response and international operations. It emphasizes cross-community understanding that focus the ways that armed forces, government civilian agencies, nongovernmental organizations, and inter-governmental organizations can work more effectively alongside each other in disaster relief.

P179018 - Civil-Military Responses to Terrorism

This course provides a holistic understanding of terrorism as one of many transnational threats all governments face. The program utilizes case studies and a tabletop exercise to stimulate discussion which assists in providing participants with the insight needed to design successful strategies to defeat terrorist networks, protect citizens and property, and address the root causes of terrorism.

P179931 - Institutional Capacity Building for Logistics

This course provides participants an opportunity to better comprehend and apply logistics management concepts and principles to build and strengthen their logistics institutional capacity. It examines eight logistics topics including logistics governance and operational planning.

P170030 - Managing Internal Conflict

This course explores the causes of and responses to conflict within a country such as violent religious fundamentalism, terrorism, ethnic & communal violence, separatism, and insurgency. Many countries must confront these situations at home as well as abroad, such as during peace operations. Participants learn and practice conflict analysis techniques, gain exposure to prevention and political-military response strategies, and discuss security sector capabilities needed to respond effectively.

P179938 - Developing Cyber Organizations and Workforces

This course focuses on establishing an organization and workforce capable of conducting defensive missions in cyberspace takes careful, deliberate planning and collaborative relationships across a ministry and across government. It provides concepts and knowledge necessary to lead the development of an organizations' cyber strategy, cyber policy, cyber budgeting, cyber acquisition, and cyber workforce.

P179085 - UN Peacekeeping Operations Contingent Commanders Course

The United Nations Peacekeeping Operations Contingent Commanders (PKOCC) course prepares participants to take on roles and responsibilities of contingent, battalion, and sector commanders in complex peacekeeping operations (PKO) for the United Nations (UN) and other multinational organizations. Participants will learn the legal framework of UN PKO and the attendant Integrated Mission Planning Process (IMPP) and gain awareness and understanding of the various components of peacekeeping operations (PKO).

P173034 - Civilian Harm Mitigation

The course assists those responsible for promoting security and addressing threats in armed conflict. In addition to promoting legal and humanitarian imperatives, civilian harm mitigation supports security goals and strengthens military effectiveness. Mitigating civilian harm is also an expectation and norm for a modern, professional military. Participants will learn how mitigating civilian harm can and should be integrated into many facets of military operations, with the opportunity to develop and practice strategies and techniques in break-out sessions and in response to historical case studies.

P179927 - Building Institutional Capacity in the Maritime Security Sector

This course will assist both civilian and military maritime security practitioners and decision-makers better understand current and emerging threats in order to prepare and implement appropriate service, inter-agency and regional responses at the operational and strategic levels. By demonstrating current operational doctrine, organization and global "best practices" for the planning and execution processes required to protect a nation's territorial seas and exclusive economic zone (EEZ). The course will cover risk analysis, maritime governance, enhancing maritime domain awareness (MDA) capabilities.

P179976 - Women, Peace and Security in Peacekeeping Operations

The course aim is to develop understanding of the United Nations Women, Peace and Security (UN WPS) agenda, specifically its importance and implications for national peacekeeping commitments and training. The Women, Peace and Security in Peacekeeping Operations (WPS PKO) course assists participants to effectively support the WPS agenda as military members of a peacekeeping mission. Participants will discuss uniformed women's participation in peacekeeping, including barriers, opportunities, and linkages to peacekeeping capabilities and identify lessons learned and implementation strategies on gender responsive peacekeeping from current PKOs.

P179898 - Strategies and Capabilities for Cyber Challenges

This course equips participants with the knowledge and skills to understand cyber threats, vulnerabilities and their consequences for national security and military operations. The course explores strategies and capabilities to maintain an advantage over actors who seek to exploit, disrupt, or damage critical networks, systems, and services that our societies and militaries depend upon. Instructors highlight the importance of a comprehensive approach that applies whole-of-government coordination, regional collaboration, and public-private partnership to counter cyber-enabled malicious actors across the spectrum of conflict.

P179897 - Securing the State: Building Institutions for National Security

This course equips participants with the skills needed to utilize capabilities-based assessments to identify capability gaps in the security and defense arenas and explores how to prepare national security institutions to address the national security threats. The course offers approaches to ensure healthy civil military relations and interagency coordination to ensure effective, whole-of-government responses to national security challenges.
