CIVIL-MILITARY RELATIONS (CMR)

EXECUTIVE PROGRAM IN DEFENSE DECISION MAKING **P471061**

This virtual offering is structured to empower participants with the knowledge and skill sets needed to be effective decision-makers, and act as agents of change to transform their security institutions to address ever-evolving national security challenges. The course is designed for senior (O-6 and above) military officers and their civilian counterparts from legislatures, government ministries, and non-governmental organizations (NGOs). Ideally, participants should hold positions of responsibility concerning strategic planning and civil-military relations issues (e.g., security policy and national strategy formulation, defense budgeting, civil society organizations and academia.)

INTERNATIONAL DEFENSE ACQUISITION RESOURCE MANAGEMENT (IDARM)

PRINCIPLES OF DEFENSE ACQUISITION MANAGEMENT **P471200**

This virtual offering provides a theoretical examination of the underlying concepts and fundamentals of defense acquisition management. International best practices are discussed along with challenges associated with implementation. Participants will gain an increased understanding of the important concepts and challenges associated with defense acquisition and logistics decision making. Sample topics include: Defense Acquisition Overview, Principles of Good Budgeting and Resource Management, Life Cycle Cost Management, and Building and Sustaining Accountability in Defense Acquisition Decision Making. This offering is designed for international military officers and civilian equivalents of grades O4-O6 who are engaged in a broad range of acquisition fields such as policy development, strategic planning, requirements definition, logistics, program management, procurement and contracting, and budgeting and execution.

MARITIME SECURITY (MARSEC)

BUILDING INSTITUTIONAL CAPACITY IN THE MARITIME SECURITY SECTOR **P471927**

This virtual offering is designed to assist those individuals and organizations responsible for their nation's maritime environment. The course will cover various threats, the detection and monitoring of suspect vessels in the nation's Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ), territorial seas and inland waterways, and appropriate responses. It is tailored to meet the needs of operational forces, decision makers at all levels, and regional security organizations. The intended audience is mid-to senior level military (Navy and Coast Guard O-4 to O-8), or civilian and law enforcement officials from various ministries and government organizations with maritime security responsibilities such as Defense, Interior, Fisheries, and Foreign Affairs.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT & RESILIENCE (EM&R)

NATIONAL RESILIENCE FOR DEFENSE & SECURITY **P471928**

The virtual offering equips participants with the knowledge to develop a resilience-based national preparedness framework that can improve national and collective security in the face of complex threats and hazards, including large scale disasters, domestic crises, and irregular or hybrid warfare threats. The course will orient participants to successful resilience models in which all facets of society contribute to keeping their nation safe, sovereign, and functional. The course will emphasize planning considerations and capabilities requirements for countering full-spectrum threats and hazards that impact governance, critical infrastructure, and essential goods and services. It will also explore government coordination with the civil and private sector that reflects the increasingly inter-connected and inter-dependent nature of contemporary defense and security requirements.

ENERGY SECURITY & CRITICAL ENERGY INFRASTRUCTURE PROTECTION **P471929**

The virtual offering aims to provide an increased awareness and understanding of the most pertinent and applicable topics related to energy security, including geopolitics, threats to energy infrastructure, energy security in the maritime domain, the intersection of cybersecurity and energy systems, critical infrastructure protection, and inter-ministerial and industry cooperation. Participants will identify regional dynamics, threats, and challenges associated with national and regional energy security and resilience; delineate essential capability requirements within energy security domains of critical infrastructure protection and cybersecurity; assess which infrastructure is critical to energy systems; and understand national and regional coordination requirements for energy systems resilience across civil-military organizations. This course is conducted in partnership with the Naval Postgraduate School's Energy Academic Group.
