The Institute for Security Governance (ISG) Train the Trainers (T3) peacekeeping course enhances the skills of trainers, enabling them to develop situational training exercises (STX) based on peacekeeping mission mandates, essential tasks, and implied tasks, to achieve the mandate at the tactical level. The course meets current standards of performance established by the United Nations (UN) and includes best practices from training conducted by other nations involved in peacekeeping operations.

### OBJECTIVES

At the end of the course, participants will be able to:

- ◆ Identify major issues in modern peace support operations
- ◆ Understand the UN's role in peacekeeping operations (PKO), education, and training
- ◆ Define common UN peacekeeping tasks
- ◆ Describe and demonstrate appropriate use of processes and products for developing situational lane training
- ◆ Exhibit process-centered skills

### TOPICS

This course enhances nations' capacities to engage in peacekeeping by developing their training institutions' internal peacekeeping training capabilities and increases the number of trained training officers available to support UN peacekeeping missions. The T3 course leads participants through an analytical progression model of analyzing mandates, identifying relevant tasks, and developing STX. The training methodology is centered on presentations by subject matter experts in conjunction with group and plenary discussions. Course topics may include:

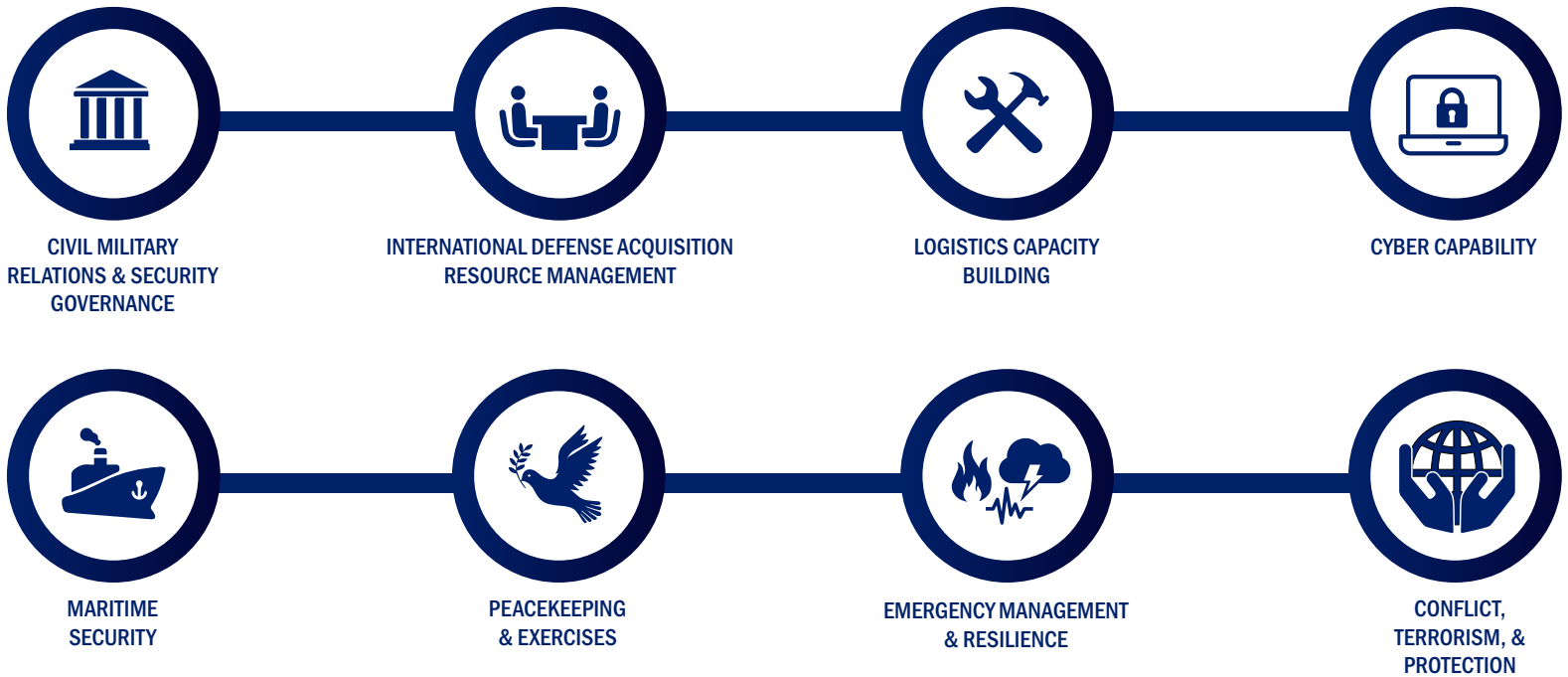
- ◆ STX design principles
- ◆ Training objectives development: top-down mission analysis
- ◆ Tactical security operations in UN PKO and lane design
- ◆ Role player utilization and scripting
- ◆ Training safety plans, exercise control, and logistics issues
- ◆ Developing evaluations and conducting after-action reviews

### PARTICIPANTS

The optimum course size is 30 participants from countries participating in the Global Peacekeeping Operations Initiative (GPOI). Participant rank or grade equivalents should be that of junior- to mid-level officers. Previous peacekeeping experience is desirable, and preference is given to nominees with training responsibility or officers serving with units earmarked for PKO deployment.

## ISG PROGRAM AREAS

ISG programming has been developed over 25 years by providing military and civilian officials with unique education and professional development programs. Courses are designed to cultivate individual understanding of complex issues, foster peer-to-peer learning, and build connected networks of international peers through a professional learning environment.



## FACULTY

ISG has a diverse faculty team grounded in professional experience from academic, military, government, and civil sectors. The core faculty are augmented by experts drawn from other parts of government, and American and international subject matter experts drawn from universities, industry, think tanks, international organizations, and non-governmental organizations.

## ENROLLMENT

Courses are conducted as part of the US Government security cooperation efforts. Interested partner nation personnel should contact their government's international cooperation section, or the relevant US Embassy's security/military cooperation section for selection processes and enrollment. Interested US citizens may contact ISG to discuss availability.

## FUNDING

Educational programs are primarily implemented through Title 22 authorized programs (International Military Education and Training, Foreign Military Sales, Peacekeeping Operations) and various Title 10 authorized programs such as the Maritime Security Initiative (MSI) and Regional Defense Combating Terrorism and Irregular Warfare Fellowship Program (RDFFP).
