## UNITED NATIONS LOGISTICS OFFICERS COURSE

The Institute for Security Governance (ISG) United Nations Logistics (UNLOG) Officers Course enhances the capacities of participating nations by increasing the number and peacekeeping leadership capabilities of trained logistics officers available for selection to posts in United Nations (UN) and other peacekeeping missions. The course meets current standards of performance established by the UN and includes other nations' best peacekeeping operations (PKO) training practices.

### OBJECTIVES

At the end of this course, participants will be able to:

- ◆ Understand major issues in modern PKO
- ◆ Understand the UN structure enabling the performance of logistical staff duties
- ◆ Review logistics management structures, including national, mission, and UN headquarters responsibilities
- ◆ Understand national roles and responsibilities concerning logistics for deployment/redeployment, supply, and sustainment
- ◆ Establish baseline logistics staff skills necessary for operating within a UN, coalition, or regional peacekeeping force headquarters

### TOPICS

The goal of this training is to improve the abilities of national armed forces to participate in UN PKO in order to resolve international crises. The training methodology includes presentations from subject matter experts, group and plenary discussions, and classroom exercises. The focus of group discussions and exercises is problem-solving based on a fictitious PKO scenario or on standalone problems related to various aspects of PKO. Course topics may include:


- ◆ The UN logistics system
- ◆ Contingent-owned equipment
- ◆ Logistics guidelines and integrated service support (ISS)
- ◆ Force generation and UN standby arrangements system
- ◆ Movement control: general, sea, and air
- ◆ Rotation, repatriation, liquidation, engineering, procurement, and personnel

### PARTICIPANTS

Participant rank or grade should be O-3 to O-5 or civilian equivalents. Preference is given to nominees with training responsibilities or those earmarked for service as PKO logistics officers in United Nations (UN) multinational and sector headquarters.

# ISG PROGRAM AREAS

ISG programming has been developed over 25 years by providing military and civilian officials with unique education and professional development programs. Courses are designed to cultivate individual understanding of complex issues, foster peer-to-peer learning, and build connected networks of international peers through a professional learning environment.



## FACULTY

ISG has a diverse faculty team grounded in professional experience from academic, military, government, and civil sectors. The core faculty are augmented by experts drawn from other parts of government, and American and international subject matter experts drawn from universities, industry, think tanks, international organizations, and non-governmental organizations.

## ENROLLMENT

Courses are conducted as part of the US Government security cooperation efforts. Interested partner nation personnel should contact their government’s international cooperation section, or the relevant US Embassy’s security/military cooperation section for selection processes and enrollment. Interested US citizens may contact ISG to discuss availability.

## FUNDING

Educational programs are primarily implemented through Title 22 authorized programs (International Military Education and Training, Foreign Military Sales, Peacekeeping Operations) and various Title 10 authorized programs such as the Maritime Security Initiative (MSI) and Regional Defense Combating Terrorism and Irregular Warfare Fellowship Program (RDFFP).
