Functional Area Description

The Building Partner Capacity (BPC) functional area prepares the BPC professional to plan, implement, and manage security cooperation efforts that establish and strengthen a partner's defense and security sector. BPC is U.S. grant assistance and as such, deep analysis and understanding of the partner and our own security needs are required to develop, manage, and sustain a security capability. The BPC functional track critically assesses the deep assumptions about the foundations of security studies while keeping in mind that security cooperation is an instrument of foreign policy.

BPC professionals will understand their operating environments, become intimately familiar with the SC activities in their regions, and be able to synchronize, sequence and manipulate many tools, processes, and timelines across the five domains to make a difference in the world of security cooperation.
